The Hospice was created to respond to the care, clinical, psychological and spiritual needs of cancer patients in an advanced and terminal stage and to offer support to their families.

The aim of the Hospice is to guarantee global assistance to the patient, personalizing the care in order to ensure the quality of life of that patient, while respecting his dignity.

The aims it pursues are the following:

- integrate the home palliative care service for the pain control and containment;
- temporarily lift the families of the load welfare;
- allow the sick, with short hospitalizations, to overcome crisis situations difficult to control at home e that do not require hospitalization;
- replace the house when that of the sick person is not suitable or when the patient is alone;
- facilitate the continuity of emotional relationships;
- allow a "protected discharge" at home discharges are agreed with the Doctor of General Medicine and with the assistance service domicile of the ASL company.

Palliative care provided in hospices represents an integrated, therapeutic and welfare response to the needs of the patient and his family. They are aimed not only at the treatment of pain and symptoms that may occur in this phase of the disease but are aimed at "taking care" of the person, also from a psychological, social and spiritual point of view, with constant attention to everything that is it can and must be done to improve their quality of life. Palliative care is in fact, according to the definition of the World Health Organization, "active care aimed at the physical, psychological, emotional, social and spiritual dimensions of the patient and his family, with the aim of improving the quality of life by offering an global and effective for the needs of the sick person ". It is for this reason that in the Hospice care is centered on the patient and, in respect of his values, its main objective is to give meaning and meaning to every moment of his life. In the Hospice, the treatments and assistance that are

provided, therefore, are aimed at controlling the symptoms that bring suffering and discomfort to the patient;

the real priority becomes that which the patient indicates

to us by expressing her needs.
